All of the following awards shall be understood to carry prize money of \$5.00, \$3.00, and \$2.00 for the first, second and third place, unless otherwise stated with the specific award.

A five dollar award will be paid to the donor of the special award that draws the most entries.

Winners of blue ribbons do not enter the same section, class, and size again for five years

TROPHY AWARD

- (1) Peggy Sweeny Award: **Div IX**, Sec 22, CL 22-1.6 Various. Specialized to round buttons with square design on the button. Assorted Materials.

ANNE MCKOWN MEMORIAL AWARD

- (2) **Div IX**, Sec 21, CL 21-9, Med/Lg. Best assortment of sections 17-20, with at least four, and not over eight classes included from each section. Assorted Materials. Must be mounted in numerical order and labeled as to section and class. Limited to three studios buttons. \$50, \$30, \$20.

PAST PRESIDENT'S AWARD

- (3) **Div IX**, Sec 6 and 7, CL 6-0, 7-0, 24 Any. Eight whole numbers represented for black glass and represent nine whole numbers for clear and colored glass. Seven free choices of additional sub classes. Mount all black glass together, all clear and colored together. Must be mounted in numerical order and labeled as to class.

APPRECIATION AWARD - In appreciation to JHB for their help and support to the Colorado State Button Society.

- (4) **Div IX**, Sec 17, 18, 19, and 20. CL 17-0, 18-0, 19-0, and 20-0. 24 Any. Eight buttons beginning with the letter J, eight with the letter H, and eight with the letter B. No more than five realistic. No more than two studio buttons. Assorted materials.

DIVISION I

- (5) Sec 10, CL 10-12.4, Various. Specialized to pierced/open work, metal buttons. Try to represent pictorial sections. May have embellishments or decorative finishes. \$7, \$5, \$3. Denver Club
- (6) Sec 15, CL 15-4.1, 25 Any. Rubber back marked. Must have word Goodyear. Mount on acetate. Try to represent the pictorial sections. Blue Spruce

DIVISION III

- (7) Sec 7, CL 7-3, Small. Specialized to red, white, and blue. 14 buttons with red base, 14 buttons with white base, and 14 buttons with blue base. Any decorative finish or embellishments acceptable. Aspen Leaf
- (8) Sec, 10, CL 10-0, 20 Any. Metal Assorted, specialized to Battersea buttons. Must have backmark. Mount on acetate. \$7, \$5, \$3 Denver Club
- (9) Sec 22 and 23, CL 22-1 and 23-6.6, 25 Any. Specialized to snap-together. Assorted materials. Five from each of the pictorial sections, and five from the patterns, symbols section. Try to represent different classes in each section. No more than 12 realistic. Must be labeled as to section and class. Refer to NBS July '95, Oct. '97, and page 55 in classification book. Aspen Leaf

DIVISION IX

- (10) Sec 1, CL 1-4.2, 20 Any. Glows specialized to bubble type. Please refer to page 36 in classification book. Refer to NBS Feb. '04. Aspen Leaf
- (11) Sec 1 and 12, CL 1-0, 12-OL, 20 Lg. Celluloid and Synthetic Polymers. No balance required. No other materials allowed—except for back of button. No other material embellishments, decorative finishes, or borders. Buttons may be pierced/cut. For members who have never won a blue ribbon in the "Trophy, Past Presidents, or Memorial Awards." \$15, \$10, \$5. Lark But'ning
- (12) Sec 3, CL 3-0, small. Chinas specialized to white, cream, black, black and white, or black and cream. \$3,\$2,\$1. Lark But'ning
- (13) Sec 3, CL 3-OL, 25 Any. Chinas specialized to white, cream, black, black and white, or black and cream. Limited to those who have never won a ribbon in china buttons. \$3,\$2,\$1. Lark But'ning
- (14) Sec 12, CL 12-6L, Mixed. Represent the colors of the rainbow (spectrum—red, blue, yellow, green, orange, and violet). Sew through only. The face of the button needs to be any or all of the six listed colors. No class identification required. No balance required. For members with less than five blue ribbons. \$3,\$2,\$1. Lark But'ning
- (15) Sec 14, CL 14-0, 25 Any. Assorted wood. May have embellishment or decorative finishes. Blue Spruce (16) Sec 17, CL 17-3LMed/Lg. Fish. Variety of fish more important than assorted materials. Limited to those who have never won a ribbon in this class. Lark But'ning
- (17) Sec 17 and 19, CL 17-0, 19-OL, 25 Any. Animals and plants native to Colorado. Ten plants and ten animals. Five free choice of above. Assorted materials. Twenty percent rule applies on realistic and studio buttons. Extinct animals excluded. Limited to those winning ten or less ribbons. \$3, \$2, \$1. Mountain Club

- (18) Sec 17 and 20, CL 17-0, 20-3, 20 Any. Animal life specialized to animals participating in human activities; may include animals wearing human clothing. No balance needed. \$7, \$5, \$3. Denver Club
- (19) Sec 17 and 20, CL 17-5, 17-2.1, 20-1, 20-22.1, 24 Any. Old McDonalds farm, variety of materials, no more than fifty percent realistic. Include four chickens or roosters, four horses, four cattle, four pigs, four sheep. A combination of four either farm buildings or farm related human transportation. No human clothing on animals. No people with animals. Aspen Leaf
- (20) Sec 17-20, CL 17-0, 18-0, 19-0, 20-0L, 20 Any. Buttons relating to European culture- Animals, plant life, objects and other pictorials. Must be labeled. Represent as many sections and countries as you can. Assorted materials. Limited to members who have won less than ten ribbons in competition. Aspen Leaf
- (21) Sec 19, CL 19-2.3, 19-2.4, 19-2.5, Various. Eight each of lilies of the valley, pansies, and roses, plus one free choice of one of the above. Assorted materials. \$7, \$5, \$3. Denver Club
- (22) Sec 19, CL 19-7.1, 25 Any. Acorns, assorted materials. Lark But'ning
- (23) Sec 20, CL 20-1, Various. Architectural structures (no scenes). No more than three studios. Assorted materials. Blue Spruce
- (24) Sec 20, CL 20-4, 20-20, 24 Any. Metal buttons specialized to children and children's stories. Not to include religious stories. Try for a balance of each (children and stories). Buttons may have other material embellishment. \$7, \$5, \$3. Denver Club
- (25) Sec 20, CL 20-19L, 20 Any. May include all major religions. People, animals, and/or icons. Exclude mythology. Must be labeled. Limited to those winning five or less ribbons. \$3, \$2, \$1. Mountain Club
- (26) Sec 22, CL 22-1.1, 22-1.2, 22-1.5, 22-1.7, 24 Any. Six buttons of each class. Basket weave, Cross, Fleur-de-lis, and Greek Key. Assorted materials. Blue Spruce
- (27) Sec 23, 23-3.3L, Various. Two hole sew through-no igloos. Material is not a major consideration. This is a chance to use your prettiest buttons, regardless of material. For those who have won no first prize ribbons in five years. Colorado Club
- (28) Sec 23, CL 23-4L, 25 Any. Borders assorted. Assorted materials. Limited to those who have never won a ribbon in this class. Lark But'ning
- (29) Sec 23, CL 23-5, Various. Three or more materials on each button. Prong settings are not included as a separate material. Blue Spruce*
- (30) Sec 23, CL 23-12, 12 extra large buttons. Buttons must be two inches or more. Assorted Materials. Try to represent the pictorial sections. Aspen Leaf

- (31) Sec 23, CL 23-12, 15 Any and 15 Stamps. Stamps matched to buttons
Main button design or theme to match postage stamp- any country.
Uniform buttons allowed. Example: train overall button- stamp with trains.
Can be canceled stamps. Colorado Club
- (32) Sec Any, CL Any, Size Any. A creative mounting of buttons or button To
be judged by the audience. \$3,\$2,\$1. Chris Snyder
